






Enrollment: Duplicated count of students who completed greater than 0 units in positive attendance courses or were present on census for all other accounting methods.

The NCTE program has increased enrollment by 51% from 2019-2020 to 2020-2021. This increase is due to successful collaborations with community partners. Also, the Continuing Education program worked with ESL and other noncredit adult education programs to develop pathways and excel learning for students whose goals is to increase workforce skills. Another factor for increased enrollment is careful scheduling that provides working adults the opportunity to attend classes in the evening with student support services that help them retain, persist, and succeed.


NCTE class fill rates increased by 27% from 2019-2020 to 2020-2021. Discontinuing multiple sections and cancelling lower enrolled courses improved the overall fill rate. We plan to work on maintaining strong fill rates through careful scheduling and promoting of current classes. The Continuing Education program provides intentional outreach and retention efforts for the local adult education population.

The efficiency increased by 4% from 2019-2020 to 2020-2021 academic year. However, it does remain 5% under the college's average. The efficiency metric will always be slightly lower for noncredit programs because of the attendance accounting method. In person and synchronous instruction use the positive attendance method instead of census rosters.

The Continuing Education staff will continue to work to improve the efficiency by offering registration and enrollment support to students. The increase in efficiency during the 2020-2021 academic year was due to the outreach strategies and collaborative partnerships with community members to develop vocational skills that support adult learners in our communities seeking gainful employment in entry level positions. The outreach activities implemented by the Continuing Education department played a key role in the increase of efficiency for this program.

As we move past the pandemic, we will strengthen our community partner collaborations to increase vocational education courses that meet the needs of local employers and the county's workforce. The Continuing Education Department goal for the coming year is to improve alignment with vocational skills courses and guided pathways to provide seamless transitions for students.


The NCTE program will be separated into two programs beginning Fall 2022. The name change for

Due to the pandemic all courses were offered through an online modality. The online learning environment was a challenge to students, and we experienced a decrease in course completion.



The success rate improved from 2019-2020 to 2020-2021 academic years by over 2%, and it was over 17% higher than the college's average. This increase in success is encouraging. The collaboration between the Continuing Education staff and NCTE faculty are a key factor in the high completion rates. Staff and faculty develop motivational and community building events. The Continuing Education Department applies an early intervention model that consists of faculty communicating

with Continuing Education staff when students are struggling and require additional support. Continuing Education staff quick response effectively help student to stay on track and provide the additional services and academic support to succeed

to navigate the community college system. Through adult education funding and the Student Equity & Achievement Plan funding, the Continuing Education is able to provide specialized supportive services for our adult education populations and ensure they have assistance with the onboarding process as well as various supportive services during their enrollment.

D. Facilities changes

The Continuing Education Department provides specialized student support services for the NCTE NABE, ESL, Adults with Disabilities, and Emeritus programs that all serve student with unique and diverse needs. The Continuing Education Department on the San Luis Obispo Campus would benefit from having a larger dedicated space. The Continuing Education staff assist students with onboarding services, including assessments, registration, and orientations for all the programs listed above. Currently, these services are provided in 3411 which is a very small office that two staff share along with two computers for students. This set up does not work. Staff are taking phone calls while students are taking tests and during peak times of the semester the line to serve students is down the hallway. We need access to computers for Continuing Education staff as well as a dedicated area with at least ten computers where students can receive assistance completing the online admissions application and taking CASAS placement tests. This space would mirror the existing Continuing Education Center at the NCC.

E. Staffing projections

Part-Time Faculty Work: We continue to need part-time faculty to teach courses, and we have part-time hiring pools almost every year. Since we do not have any full-time faculty members, we need to pay part-time faculty on special projects. For example, part-time faculty work on retention activities, curriculum development, and student office hours funded through CAEP and Student Equity. We will need to continue to pay part-time faculty to work on these essential program components.
