The Special Education Teacher Pathway will prepare students to earn the Education Specialist Instruction Credential (all ages), which will enable you to provide instructional services in your chosen Specialty Area(s): Autism Spectrum Disorders, Mild/Moderate Disabilities, Moderate/Severe Disabilities, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Visual Impairments, Physical and Health Impairments, Early Childhood Special Education, and Language and Academic Development.

WANT TO TEACH? HERE'S HOW:

- STEP 1 Be a current student at Cuesta College, or apply online at: cuesta.edu/admissionsaid/apply
- STEP 2 Complete Cuesta College's Associate Degree for Transfer in Elementary Teacher Education or Single Subject major
- STEP 3 Satisfy Basic skills requirements: qualifying scores on the CBEST, SAT, ACT or AP Exams
- STEP 4 Transfer to a university to complete a Bachelor's Degree in Liberal Studies or Single Subject major
- STEP 5 Verify Subject matter competence: may be met by completing a Liberal Studies or Single Subject Degree; or pass the California Subject Exam for Teachers (CSET)
- STEP 6 Complete an Education Specialist Instruction Credential Program at a university
