Jys for Success study strategies

2) Create a detailed schedule


- -use your phone calendar or a paper calendar
- -Set reminders

This will help you balance your personal, work, and school duties and keep you accountable.

Example: study 30min each day from 8:30-9:00pm

3) Repetition helps the memory

- -Create flashcards
- -Math: repeat similar problems
- -Record yourself explaining a concept/definition and listen to it over and over
